



Year: One

Term: Autumn 2

English

In English, we will be innovating the text 'Supertato' and we will be creating a set of instructions on how to catch the Evil Pea. The children will develop an understanding of the features of a story and how to structure a story. This term, the children will continue to embed their use of capital letters, finger spaces and full stops, as well as beginning to use 'I,' 'and' and -ed endings appropriately.

Science

This term, we will be identifying and naming a variety of everyday materials, including metal, plastic, wood, glass and paper. We will investigate the physical properties of everyday materials and begin to compare these within one another. The children will innovate a house from 'The Three Little Pigs' by using alternative building materials and predicting what would happen to their house if the wolf were to try to blow it down.

How am I making History?

This half term, we will be exploring our own personal chronology and finding out about the past within our own living memory.

Mathematics

This term, we will be comparing quantities and part-whole relationships. We will begin by comparing the height, weight and length of two objects before comparing two groups of different objects. The children will be introduced to equality and inequality signs to compare objects. We will then develop our understanding of the concepts of a whole and parts of a whole number or object.

History

In History, we are exploring 'How am I making History?' Initially, we will be exploring where what our personal chronology is. The children will begin by examining photographs and asking questions to create a simple timeline to extend back to before they were born. We will create a class memory box that the children can add to throughout the year, which we will reopen in the summer term.

RE

In RE, the children will encounter the concept of God through the promises and symbols of baptism. They will develop an understanding of what it means to belong through exploring the celebration of baptism. The children will explore the ways in which people of faith welcome babies.
