

## English

This term Year 4 are reading the 'Mousehole Cat' by Antonia Barber. This is a Cornish tale of Mowzer, the cat, and Tom, the old fisherman, who brave the fury of the Great Storm Cat to try and save their village. The children will be examining the metaphor of the storm cat and reinventing their own similar metaphor. 

#### RE

This term children will be exploring the 'The Church'. They will develop their understanding of Christianity being a multicultural worldwide faith. The children will explore the similarities and differences between Christian denominations and to develop further their understanding of symbolism. ## Mathematics
